**EXPLANATION**

Cities are topographically laid down and distinguished by Roman Capitals as YORK. County Towns topographically laid down & distinguished by large Capitals as DERRY. Borough Towns with the number of Members sent to Parliament by 1000. Market Towns are distinguished by their names in Roman Print as Farnham. Villages and Hamlets in Italian Print as Fulham, Hackney, &c. Parks and Seats of the Nobility and Gentry Post Stages. Great Direct Roads are distinguished by one line stronger than the other. Light Direct and Principal Cross Roads by two lines of equal strength. Light Cross Roads by single lines. The Figures upon the Map show the distance of the several Towns they are annexed to from London by the shortest Road or the most easily travelled by measured Miles. The Distances by Water are given in Minutes and Seconds of Time Geometrical Miles each or so to a Degree.

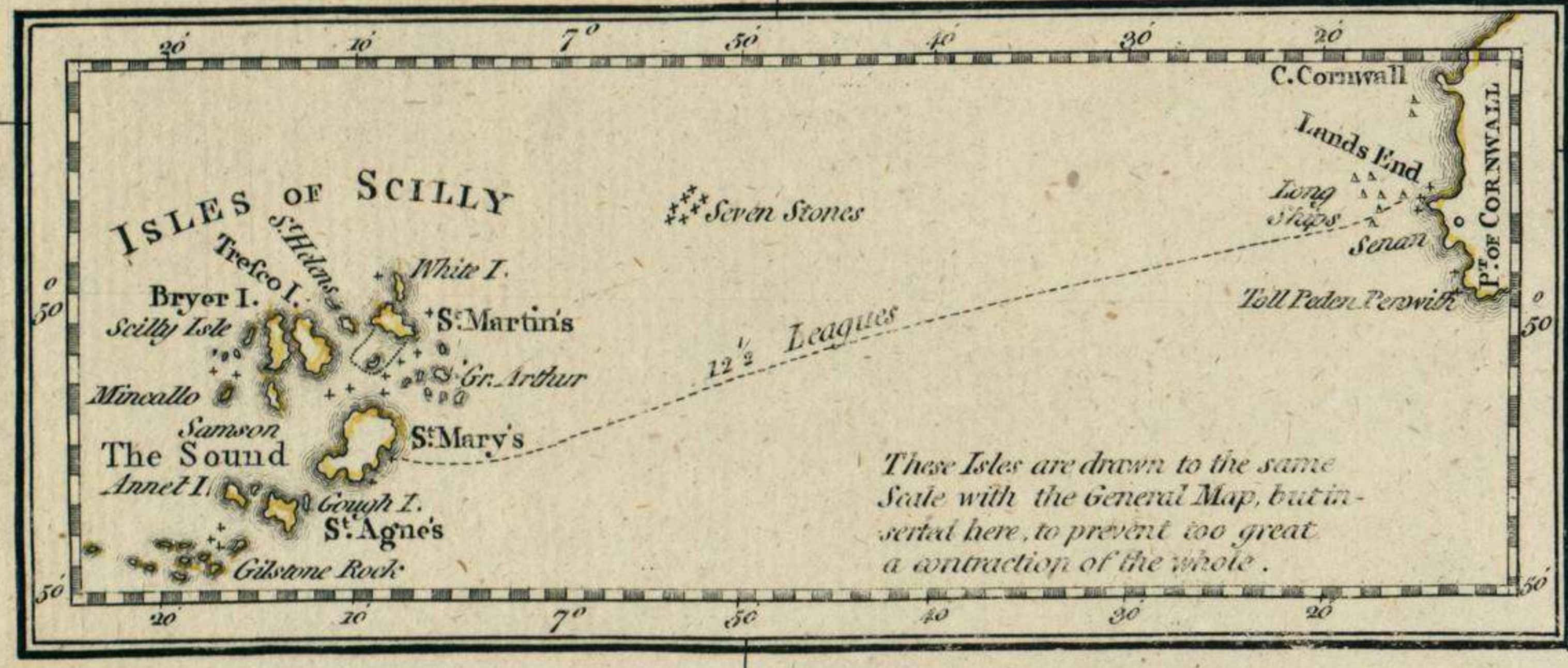


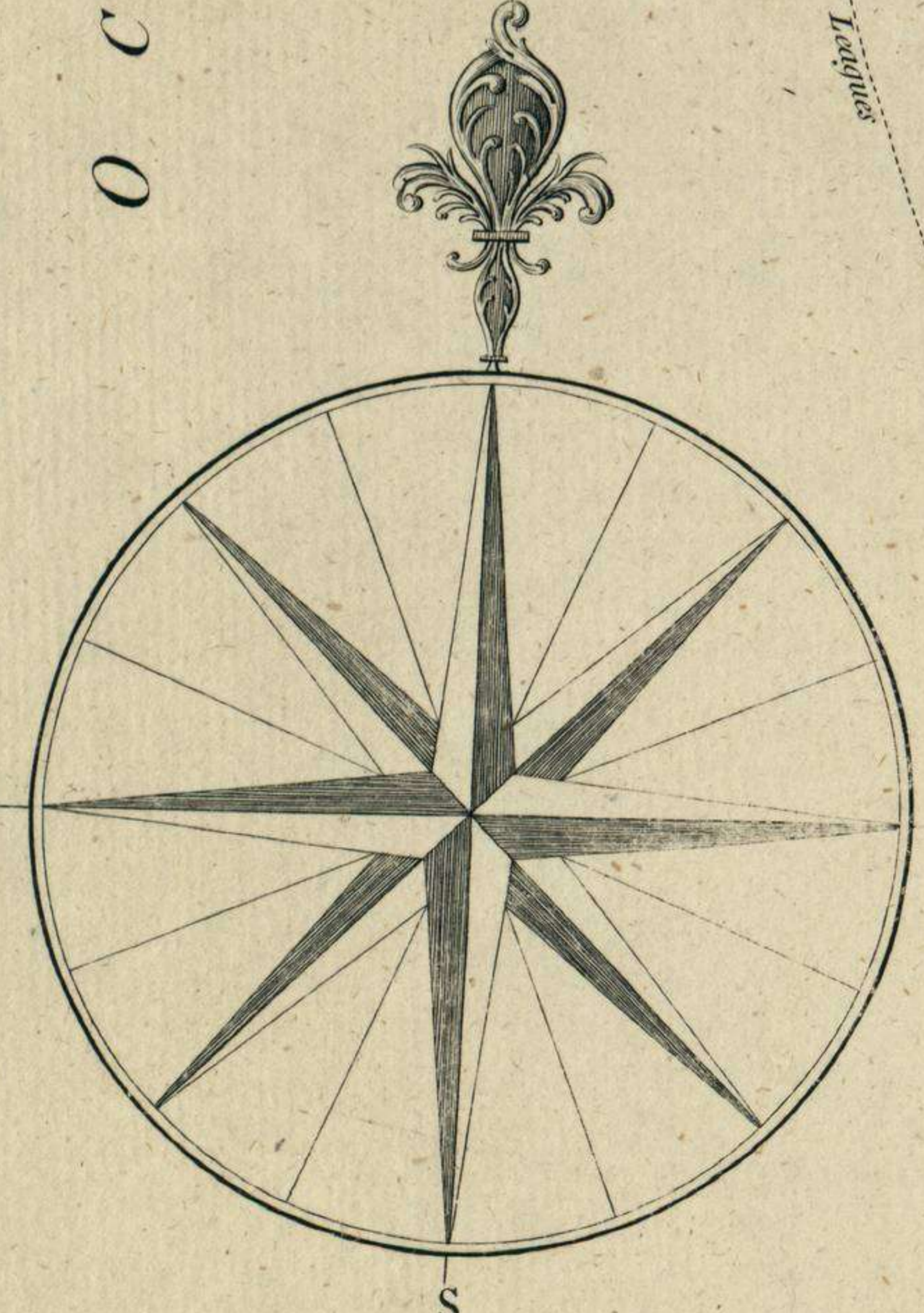
