PEREZ DE GALDOS To THE AMERICAN HEBREW: In the New York Sun of this morning, I saw that Perez de Galdos, in his time one of Spain's foremost-if not its foremost novelist—was in want, and that the King of Spain had contributed toward a fund 1884 for Galdos' support in his unhappy old age. Pogrom Agitation in Kieff (Special to The American Hebrew)

St. Petersburg, Russia, March 27.— The attempt to organize a pogrom in Kieff was made by about twenty members of the "Union of the Russian People" and of the "Double Eagle" on the anniversary of the death of the little Russian poet Schevtchenko. Among the miscreants were several students in their uniforms including the fanatic, Golubev, who achieved notoriety in the Beilis case. The pogrom began with an unitertional attack upon the shop of a "Real Russian," after which the fury of the assailants apont itself more vehemently upon
