The men's dress of Candelario is known as the *traje del choricero*, because the men used to travel about selling sausages (*chorizos*) made by the women of the village. The hat of black felt is fashioned with a wide, upturned edge of velvet on the brim. The jacket of black woolen plush, lined with coloured flannel, is warmly interlined. A sash of red silk wound about the waist half covers the waistcoat of figured black velvet. The shirt of white linen homespun is unadorned. The breeches are of black plush, and the leggings, of black broadcloth. No one now wears habitually the old dress, but it is possible to assemble a complete costume from the single garments which exist in many family chests.

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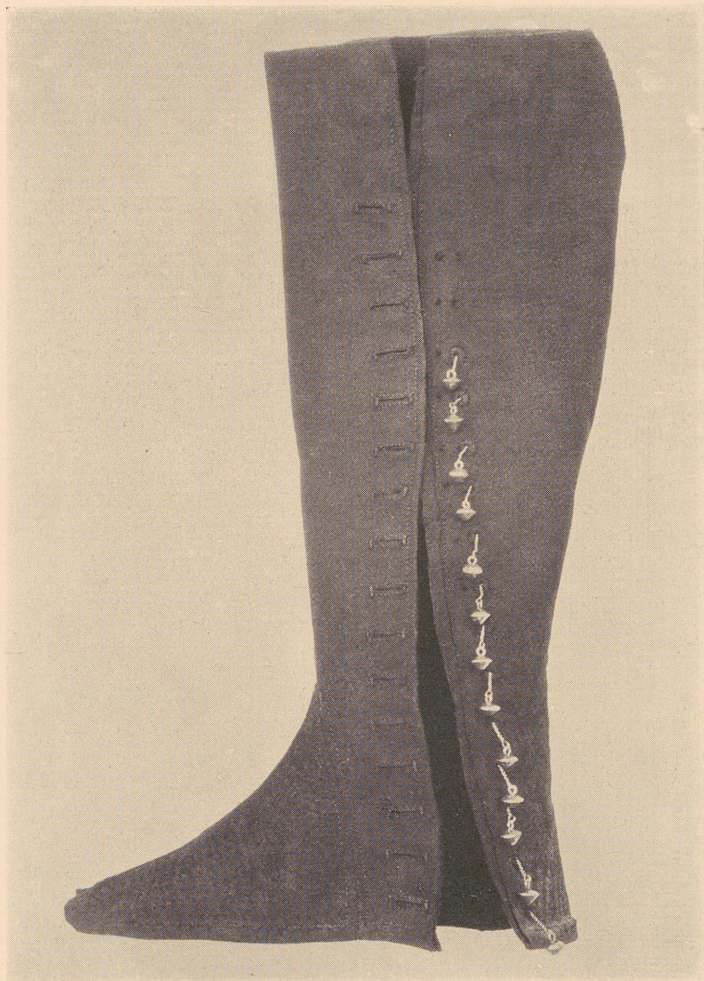
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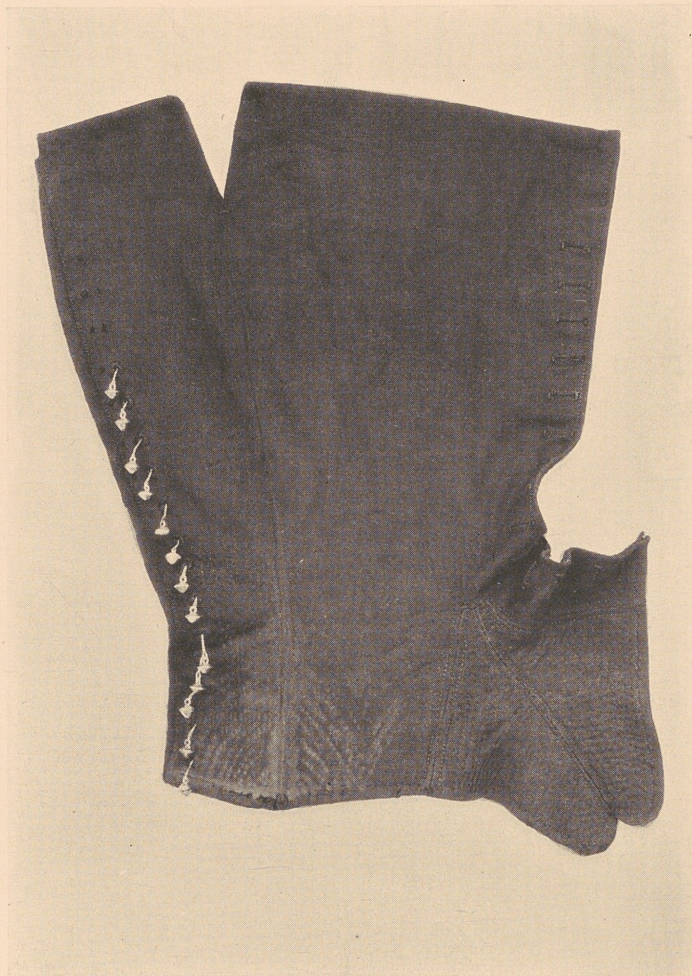
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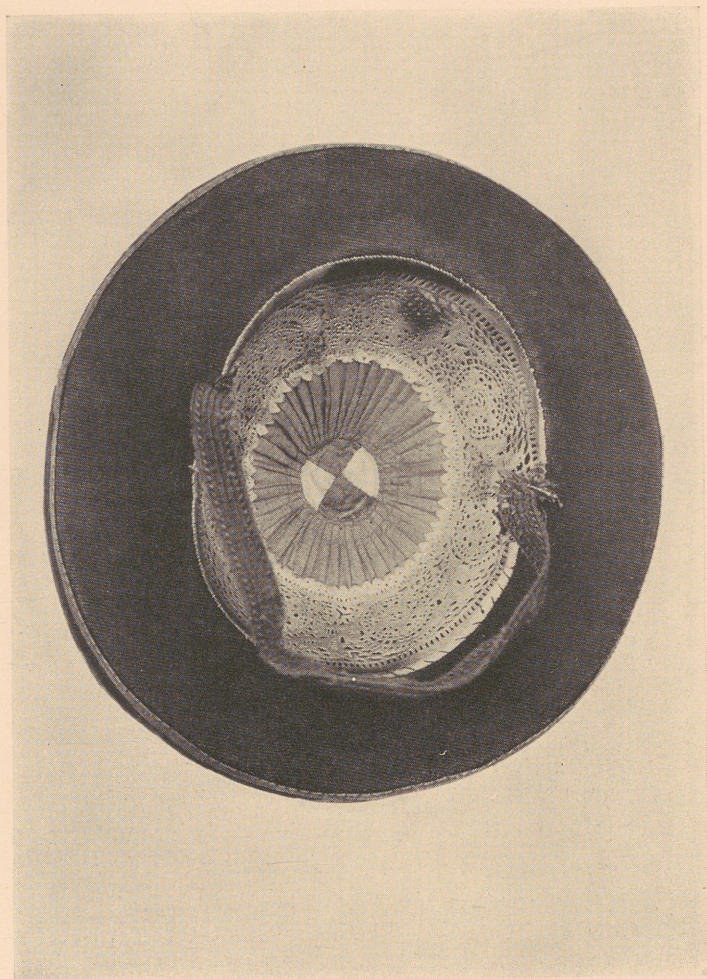
