as if it had a right to the attention of the Hearers.

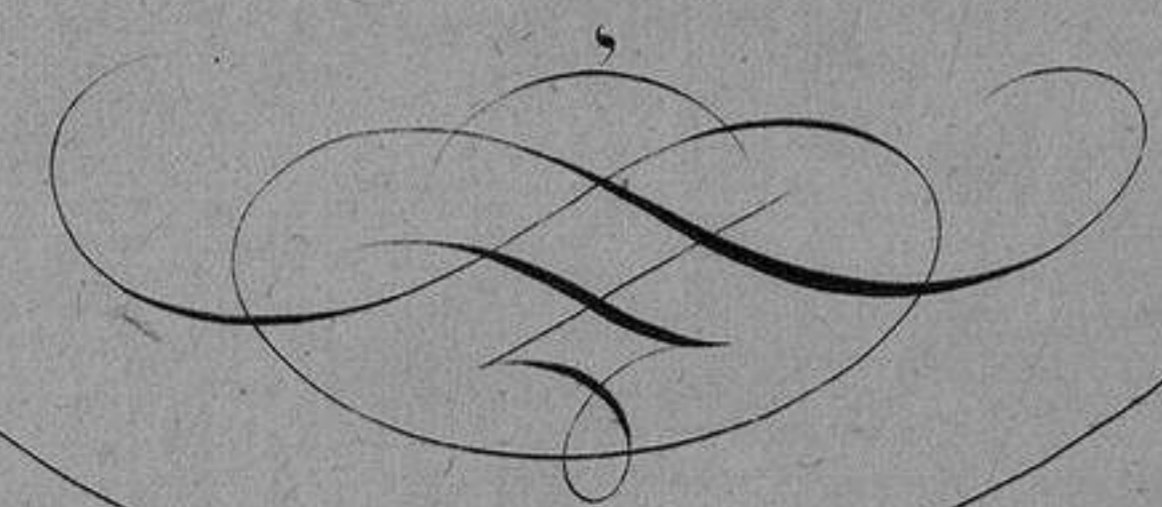

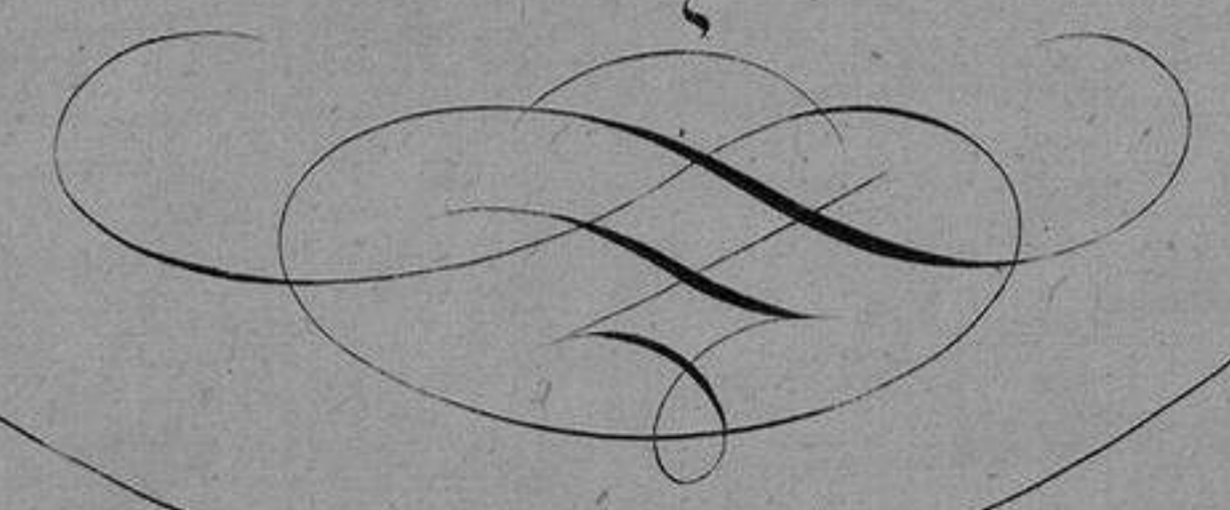
